Shirley Church Sonni McEvoy Release Coordinators The Gideons were formed in 1898 to band commercial Christian travelers together. Traveling salesman had a terrible reputation back then and the association was designed to encourage men to keep their Christian testimony strong and pure at home and on the road. There were plenty of temptations as men went about their work. A few years later, the Auxiliary, wives of Gideons, was formed. The Gideons one objective was not to distribute Scriptures but to win men, women, boys and girls to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. It remains the same today. It wasn't until 1908 that Gideons distributed their first Bibles, encouraged by a pastor.

Today we are an association of business and professional men and our member wives with that same objective. We are all members of a local church or assembly, believe the Bible is the inspired, infallible and inerrant Word of God and must have our pastor's recommendation. We are the churches men and women taking the churches message to places where people may not hear a pastor's preaching, the teaching of a Sunday school or any Christian witness. We distribute Scriptures in designated traffic lanes of life: Hotels/motels, schools, hospitals jails and the military. Gideons are organized in 200 countries, territories and possessions and distribute Scriptures in over 105 languages. We have distributed over 2.5 billion Bibles and testaments since 1908.

There is a Gideon Card Bible program where Scriptures can be dedicated in memory or in recognition of a friend or loved one. Friends of Gideons was introduced a few years ago because we realize not everyone is a business or professional man but wants to keep up with what's happening in the ministry (e-news), pray specifically or participate financially. Just Google "Friends of Gideons".

Finally, a Gideon Bible app is available for free at the App or Play store. It contains over 1200 languages and many helps for private use or personal evangelism. Many have received Christ as savior through the Gideon ministry. One seventh grader writes," Thank you so much for this free Bible. I'm only thirteen years old and this Book changed my life. I started reading it, and I started going to church. I also accepted Jesus Christ as my savior and got saved. I'm going to heaven! Thank you, thank you, thank you"!



Ramp Up


