REFLECTION: Finding Hope

PASTORAL PRAYER AND LORD'S PRAYER:

Jesus, the hope of glory, come to us now. We confess we often feel our faith is not sufficient, our hope is too small. Remind us of your words about seeds and leaven – how with you, small things can become big things. Remind us that hope, though small, and frail, is hard to kill and is pervasive in nature. And God, we ask that you use us as seeds of hope in a world that is hope-starved. Use us as small bits of leaven in a dough we sometimes think is ruined. By your grace, give to us once more the hope needed for

today, so we might have strength for the living of our days as well as the hope of a bright future with you. You are faithful and we trust in you, help us trust you more.

And God we pray for those on our circle of concern, and those we carry in our hearts today, that you would plant within them seeds of hope as well. May those seeds fall on soil that allows them to grow and bloom and spread.

And now we pray as you taught us your disciples to pray, saying,

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done. On earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil for Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. AMEN.
