The Next 60 Years of Church

We just celebrated our 60th anniversary as a church, so what's next? What are the plans for the future? What does the next 60 years hold? How about next year after General Conference? Some wonder if there will still be a United Methodist Church. Not only do I not have those answers, I know that Scripture is rather clear that we cannot know the future. It is also clear that God knows and holds our future and has good plans for us! And THAT is trustworthy and true. We can hold on to and claim the truth of Jeremiah 29:11 for ourselves and for our church. God has our good in mind and can give us hope.

I do know some things: I know our church is working towards some clear goals for 2020. We are working to increase attendance. We are working to increase the general energy level. We are working to launch at least one Fresh Expression, and are in the process of launching 3 more. And we are working to have a way to disciple folks who are new to the faith. To achieve some of this we will be having new learning opportunities. We will also be launching a second service in 2020 (there's a separate article about that within).

Why? Why are we concerned with these things? Aren't we vital? Don't we celebrate in worship how well we are doing? Yes. We do. And we are vital. We are doing better than we have done in a long time. But what matters more than statistics and us feeling good is the tens of thousands of people around us who need to know Jesus and don't—I'm also concerned that the Church (not just our church but the United Methodist Church, and the Church in general) tends to operate in a model that no longer fits the world around us. So to position ourselves to succeed, not just in 2020, but for the next 60 years and beyond we need to continue to follow Jesus and to seek God's will. We will need to make modifications to the way we have done some things. And while we make those changes we will also hold on to what is essential—the core of who we are. What never changes is the message. What might change is the method.

This year I have been a part of something called the Pioneer Generative Leadership Academy, it ties in, loosely with my Doctoral Program, and some ongoing work with the conference which also ties into my doctoral work. All of this flows into what I am working on—to Re-Mission and Re-Tradition (to help us live into a living tradition) and Re-Tool the Church through Fresh Expressions. Through November I will be sharing in the sermon time some insight on how Fresh Expressions are formed and how that might apply to the church of the present and the future. Still not sure what I mean by Fresh Expressions? That's ok. You will—it is really just the newest way of fulfilling the Great Commission Jesus gave us in Matthew 28:19-20—to go and make disciples.

The most important part of the church of the future though, is YOU, you have a part to play. You have a place in the church of the present and the future. You are a part of the hope that God gives us for the future. I'm not sure what all the future entails but I know God will be with us as we walk the road together and for that I am thankful!

Explanatory Notes:

- What does the "Variance" column represent? To find the variance subtract the "Budget" from the "Actual." If this is a negative number in income it means that we budgeted to receive more than we have actually received. If this is a negative number in expense it means that we have spent less than we budgeted to spend.
- Income: Once again, we budgeted for a large increase this year. Through SEPTEMBER
 we are ahead of budget but it should be noted that some givers choose to pay their entire tithe at the beginning of the year. Also, income in churches tends to be cyclical
 meaning that we receive more income at the beginning and end of the year. We have
 also kept spending under budget in most areas.
- Expenses: These are grouped for convenience.
- Capital Improvements This includes all improvements to all Church-owned facilities.
 We expect to spend additional funds in the coming months.
- Pastor Salary & Benefits This includes salary, business reimbursements, pension, and health care stipend.
- Staff Salaries This includes salaries for all Church staff except for the Pastor.
- Apportionments The global United Methodist Church and the Florida Annual Conference bill us monthly for our portion of shared expenses. These apportionments are calculated based on how much money a church spends on itself (verses spending on mission in the world.) It goes to support such things as the bishop's salary, conference staff salaries, district needs, and global work of the church.

Update on Church Parsonage

On Sunday, October 20th, a Town Hall meeting was held after church to share with the congregation the plans for the sale of the church parsonage at 1040 Penman Road. This parsonage was purchased in 1985, but was constructed in 1955. With an older home (65 year old home) comes a high cost of upkeep and maintenance both inside and out (on the 1 acre lot) that continues to grow. In addition mold has been found in the parsonage in the past and again this year. It was re-mediated. However, the house continues to have moisture problems.

When the house was purchased it was expected to be a terrific location for the pastor and family and it was! However, in the 30 plus years Penman Rd has become a very different place to live. It is a very busy road and is very difficult to get in and out of the driveway. This year Pastor Bridget was in a minor car accident trying to get out of the driveway and previously Pastor Chris had been in a very near miss. It's also not a safe location for children to run and play in the front yard.

An appraisal will be obtained for the current parsonage to assess the value. The broker we are working with, who is well established at the Beaches, presumes that the house will be flipped (torn to the studs) or torn down completely and the primary value of the property is the land and the location. Comparable properties have sold for anywhere from \$350,000-\$500,000 and have been on the market for 4-45 days. We will have a specially called charge conference, an official act of business with the District Superintendent, Rev. Jay Therrell, on Monday, Nov. 4th at 6 pm in the Sanctuary to have an official vote.

A task team has been established to purchase a new parsonage. Using the guidance of both the conference and the District Superintendent, we will be purchasing a new parsonage rather than switching to a housing allowance. We will follow conference and district guidelines and have set as a church additional parameters to assure that we take into account maintenance, travel time, and other factors. These include that the home have 3 bedrooms with an office, or 4 bedrooms. It must be no more than 20 minutes away. It needs to be in an A/B school zone (for all grades). Additional guidelines are in place as well.

The task team is well rounded and well thought out. They will secure a bridge loan and purchase the new parsonage this fall/winter. Pastor Bridget and family will most likely move by the end of the year. The current parsonage will be put on market in the spring, its sale will close the bridge loan. Should the old parsonage sell for more than the new parsonage cost, the difference will be used for capital needs at the church (per the requirement of The Book of Discipline).

Stewardship: What is it Really?

Stewardship: noun: the conducting, supervising, or managing of something especially: the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to one's care

Stewardship is such a church-y word. It's probably one that you don't hear used a lot outside of the context of the church world. The word appeared in the middle ages and is tied especially to taking care of another's property. Often this was done during the crusades or when one had to travel from one part of the country to another as that took so long. The steward had full responsibility for the owner's property and was to manage it responsibility.

There is an example of a steward in Scripture. We just don't see it called "Steward" anywhere but in the King James Bible. Why? Because the King James Bible was written to an audience that had and knew what Stewards and Stewardship meant. The story is found in Luke 16. All of today's translations render "steward" as "manager." And that is fitting. Think about it. We don't tend to hand over all of our household to another person. But in the business world the owner or owners often entrust the finances of their company to a manager (or several depending on the size of the business) and they expect the manager will treat the money not as their own but that they will manage it according to how the owner would like. So there are some guiding principles we can pick up from Luke 16 which is the only place in all of the King James that the word steward or stewardship is mentioned.

- 1. You, I, we are in fact the steward, the manager. We are not the owner. God is the owner. Psalm 24 makes that clear. Genesis 1 makes that clear.
- 2. You, I, we have been entrusted with a little or a lot depending on our situation—our job is faithfulness. Our job is to make God (the owner) look good (-this is what the steward is praised for in the parable in Luke 16). How can you use what's been entrusted to you to make GOD, not you, look good?
- 3. You cannot serve two masters, you cannot ride two horses with one rear-end, you must choose which one is more important—God or money. That does not mean you cannot have money and love God, but it means you cannot mix up your priorities. Where does your loyalty lie? Which is more important? Having a stocked up retirement account, or a nice house or both—OR making GOD look good with your money (being generous)?
- 4. The one who really knows our hearts and our intentions is God. We do not have to worry about what others think or how they respond to our stewardship.

If you have not read Luke 16, I encourage you to go read it. Read it in a couple of different versions. It will be eye opening to see the differences in the translations and what that may tell you about how the culture has changed through the years in its views of stewardship.

Thank you for all you do in your efforts to make God look amazingly good here at Christ UMC Neptune Beach!
